

“The trust leaders have set a clear vision for their schools. This is rooted in the mantra of a desire for pupils and staff at the Trust to ‘flourish’ in their development.”


Summary Evaluation


Gilmorton Chandler

Progress was significantly above average in all areas, whilst progress in Mathematics was among the highest scores in the East Midlands. All Saints CE Primary School has undergone a complete transformation of our learning environments!

Our new bespoke Early Years classrooms and designated EYFS base provide stimulating environments and learning space for our younger children, and Years 1 and 2 classrooms have also had a facelift. Key Stage Two has also seen dramatic changes, with six classrooms now wrapping around the newly designed library. Not to forget our school hall, which has nearly doubled in size!

A purpose-built learning base – The Meadow – is now available to support children to increase independence as they prepare for secondary school. In the words of our children, 'The Meadow is amazing!'

All new spaces are light, spacious and benefit from the latest technology, and are designed to support our children's learning. It's taken six years and cost approximately £2.6m but we've got there!

What a journey it's been transforming the learning environments. We look forward to continuing our journey in 'guiding all our flock to flourish' over the days, months and years to come.



Claybrooke


Primary School

Primary School

It is a time of growth for us at John Wycliffe, as we expand our number of classrooms to meet the rising demand for school places.

With support from Leicestershire County Council, over £1 million has been invested to create 'The Whittle Wing', a new block containing four specifically designed classrooms, a new studio and several small group rooms. The new build has allowed us to transform previous teaching spaces into creativity areas to fill the school with art, design, music and singing.

We have also been strengthening ties with local secondary schools. Our new programme of links includes secondary students coming into JWPS to read with our children, Sports Ambassadors sharing ideas to increase participation in sports and art students helping our children shape their artwork being created for The Whittle Wing.

All this growth means there are new spaces for children in every year group and the opportunity for more children to join us as we strive for excellence in all that we do enabling 'the children of Lutterworth to take off into their futures'.
